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Effective, May 1, 2017, CareSource will implement the Drug Screening Payment Policy. Reimbursement policies are designed to assist you when submitting claims to CareSource. They are routinely updated to promote accurate coding and policy clarification. These proprietary policies are not a guarantee of payment. Reimbursement for claims may be subject to limitations and/or qualifications.

#### **SUMMARY**

The Drug Screening Payment Policy will reduce the number of covered screenings CareSource members are eligible for per quarter. In addition, CareSource will not cover drug testing at non-par laboratories.

#### **IMPACT**

Drug screenings will not require prior authorization. However, medical records must substantiate the medical necessity for each test ordered.

CareSource will reimburse for up to 5 qualitative/presumptive drug screening test CPT codes in a quarter per member. CareSource will also reimburse for up to 5 quantitative/confirmatory drug screening test CPT codes in a quarter per member.

CareSource will not cover drug testing performed at non-par laboratories. CareSource requires labs to directly bill CareSource. A prior authorization for additional tests beyond limits is not available for coverage.

Claims not meeting the necessary criteria as described in the policy document will be denied.
